CURRENT EXHIBITION

DEC 2012 - MAY 2013 Rodin, Wings of Glory

In partnership with the Musée Rodin, this exhibition offers passengers the opportunity to see original molds of some of the most famous works of sculptor August Rodin, such as The Kiss and the Thinker.

A theme on Movement and Flight also allows passengers to discover Rodin's passion for planes, winged angels exhibited for the very first time, and his genius and talent for instilling movement in statuary...



UPCOMING EXHIBITIONS

All exhibitions at Espace Musées carry a universal message, easily understandable to all cultures, and of undeniable artistic quality and importance.

Three main categories of exhibitions guide our curating choices:

1. Thematic Exhibitions

Ex: travel, happiness, human activity: work, entertainment, sports, food, clothing...

2. Plastic Topics

Ex: the dot, the line and surface, structure and rhythm, color...

3. Monographic Exhibitions

Ex: Rodin, Dubuffet, Maillol, etc...

ESPACE MUSÉES ART @ PARIS-CDG AIRPORT !

- Espace Musées exhibits art works in a 250- square-metre space built exclusively to that purpose, by some of Paris' most renowned museum architects.
- A giant glass entrance catches the eye of every passerby.
- Inside, wooden floors, high ceilings and black metallic ornaments provide visitors with a true museum feel.
- Glass protections allow the museum to be open from first flight to last flight without interruption.
